"My sheep hear my voice."

My dear friends today we celebrate the 4th Sunday of Easter. Yes, let us say it again: *Christ is risen, Alleluia!!!* Indeed, in today's gospel, the risen Lord appears to us as the "good shepherd" who perfectly knows each of his sheep. Some of us or almost all know well the life of the shepherds. We know that his job begins very early in the morning and that it does not allow any day off. A real shepherd loves his flock, and his duty is to be continuously attending to their needs. But here we need to be precise about the sense of the verb *to know*. In the world of the Bible, this does not mean that Jesus has information about the people (their name, their age, the place where they live). When Jesus says to us that He *knows* His sheep, that means that He loves them. He sees the weaknesses of each one and he worries about us. His love is so big that he gave his life for us.

In front of so much love, we feel very miserable. We discover that really, we do not know the Lord. Nowadays there are so many places of formation in the Bible, even in our parish. And nevertheless, we continue to see the religious ignorance of many people and of the Catholic Christians.

The gospel of this Sunday precisely insists on the importance of listening: *"my sheep hear my voice."* To listen, this supposes a dialog between at least two persons who give themselves mutual attention. *To listen*, is to be opened to another one, is to receive his word with respect and generosity, is to be persuaded that his word is more important than ours. Such reception needs, from both parts, times of silence. Many words and talks sometimes are an obstacle to listening.

This call to listen to the Lord, we find it in the Bible. Christ did it someday when he said: *"blessed are those who listen to the Word of God."* (Luke 11: 22). The problem is that many people hear but do not listen. This began from the beginning of humanity: Adam heard God's Word; he was afraid and hid because "he did not listen" to this voice that was offering him a way of life.

It is just by listening to the voice of the Lord that we learn "to know Him better." This verb *to know*, we must understand it in the sense of "to be born with." To be born with, we must frequently to Jesus, have time for him, and live with Him. We will know Him really when we will agree to be taken into his powerful love. Once again, it is not about intellectual knowledge but about loving knowledge.


So far all I was explaining leads us to the third attitude: the sheep follow their shepherd. To follow the Lord is to be accompanied by Him. We can trust Him because He leads us on the way to real life: it is what Saint Peter said to Jesus someday: *"Lord, to whom might we go? You have the words of eternal life."* What Jesus wants to offer us is a life of boundless happiness. Let us think about the father of the prodigal son. This son asks for his part of the inheritance. He did not understand that his Father had planned to give him everything. Then let us not hesitate to ask the Lord for everything, I mean the fullness of his love and his presence.

This Sunday is the world day of prayers for vocations. Vocation is the call that God directs to His people. He calls priests, religious, Christians compromised in the announcement of the Gospel or in the service of the Church. Some and others are sent. We ask the Lord of being with them in order that they do not speak erroneous, incorrect, false things of God's Word. That through our lives and our words, everyone could better enter into the knowledge and love of Jesus Christ.

Friends, I would like to invite you and all your families to the celebration of Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament parish Feast this week concluding with the family consecration mass this coming Friday. Please check this bulletin or the parish website for more information. Join us as we celebrate our common vocational call of unity under our Blessed mother's mantel.

Finally, let me tell you this: The Lord continues calling for the mission. Nobody can answer for you. He counts on you. There is too much work for all. Beseech Him in order He gives you strength and courage to take part generously in His mission of salvation of the world. Amen. God is good all the time...




