

GOD LOVES US

As I was reflecting on the readings this week, the reading from Hebrews reminded me of a column Bob Greene wrote in 2017 about Chief Justice John Roberts who had been invited to give the commencement address at his son's ninth-grade graduation. I had made a copy for myself at the time. I am sharing some of it with you as it is an example of the lesson found in today's reading from Hebrews.

Chief Justice John Roberts starts by telling his audience: "that commencement speakers will typically wish you good luck and extend good wishes to you. I will not do that, and I'll tell you why."

"Sorry to say, but I hope you will suffer betrayal, because that will teach you the importance of loyalty."

"Sorry to say, but I hope you will be lonely from time to time so that you don't take friends for granted."

"I wish you bad luck, again, from time to time so that you will be conscious of the role of chance in life and understand that your success is not completely deserved, and that the failure of others is not completely deserved either."

"And when you lose, as you will from time to time, I hope every now and then your opponent will gloat over your failure. It is a way for you to understand the importance of sportsmanship."

"I hope you will be ignored so that you know the importance of listening to others, and I hope you will have just enough pain to learn compassion."

Whether I wish these things or not, they're going to happen. And whether you benefit from them or not will depend on your ability to see the message in your misfortunes."

Bob Greene asked Chief Justice John Roberts for the genesis of his speech. His response was "that he prepared the advice specifically for that commencement address, as he set out to reflect upon some of the harsh realities that everyone will face in the course of a full life, and how to anticipate them and learn from them."

Today's reading from Hebrews is addressing the question why do we have to suffer. The community the author is writing to is facing trials and difficulties. Very often when we face trials and difficulties, we can

wonder whether God is punishing us or still loves us. The reading tells us that one of the reasons we are allowed to suffer is because God does love us.

The reading uses the example of God as a Father. What Father doesn't discipline his son. Discipline can mean punishment. It can also mean educating or training. Our God is a loving Father who wishes the best for his Sons and Daughters. However, the process of educating his children isn't always pleasant. Almost all education involves some kind of suffering or pain—be it practicing scales on a musical instrument, memorizing multiplication tables, or having our kids clean their rooms. There is a greater good that is learned from doing those things.

God wants us to grow in faith and virtue. Rather than protecting us from all unpleasant challenges in our lives, he permits us to encounter them so that a greater good can be learned.

For example, how would we learn to be courageous unless God allowed us to experience fear possibly due to loss of a job, illness, accident, loss of a loved one, or a natural disaster? How would we learn to be compassionate unless we had experienced vulnerability? How would we learn perseverance and humility unless God allowed us to fail at times and learn to get back up and try again? How could we learn to be a forgiving person unless we had the experience of having been hurt or having been in need of forgiveness ourselves? How would we learn to love unconditionally unless God allowed us to experience rejection? How would we know that we're not God and need him unless we found ourselves in situations beyond our control?

Although these experiences are painful at the time, we need to trust that God has a greater good that will emerge from it in the future. We may not always see or understand it in this life, but we will in the next life. Many of us when we look back on some great suffering in our past understand that we are stronger and wiser today because of it. These experiences if we learn from them will help our faith mature and develop deep roots and help us develop into the person that God always intended us to be. This life is only temporary. Everything we do in this life is in preparation for eternal life with the Lord.

Endure your trials as "discipline." God loves you.






