Be Like Jesus...

Last Sunday we celebrated what is called: "World Marriage Day." We decided to celebrate it in a very particular way in our parish, Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament. It was the day of the 50th, 60th, and 70th marriage anniversary of some of our parishioners. It is an important event in every life: 50, 60, 70, and more years of marriage, one close to the other. The spouses (33 couples!) were surrounded by their children, grandchildren, great-grandchildren, friends and all of us as parishioners for a day of thanksgiving and celebration. We surrounded and accompanied them with friendship, affection and prayers. Let us again give thanks to God for all his wonders.

In this Sunday's Gospel, we hear Jesus speaking to us with the very authority of God. **He focuses on two weak points: the instinct for violence and revenge.** We are often surrounded by people who are not necessarily friendly, and we have trouble loving everyone. We have trouble forgiving; **how can we love those who persecute us and make us suffer?** And yet, it is this path that Jesus took for our salvation. In one of his homilies, Pope Francis dwelt on the difficulty of loving his enemies. And he wondered how it is possible to love and forgive.

"We too have enemies... some are weak, others strong. We too sometimes become the enemies of others; we do not love them. Jesus tells us that we must love our enemies." (Pope Francis) Yes, but how can we love those who, for the sake of money, do not make affordable medicine for those who need it and let them die? How can we love people who seek only their material interests and do so much harm?

Yes, how can we do that? We indeed feel powerless and destitute. Today, Jesus invites us to turn to the Father: he makes the sun rise on the good and the bad. He wants everyone to be enlightened. His love is for all; this love is for the good and the wicked ones. Saint Paul, who persecuted Christians, allowed himself to be transformed by this love.

Jesus ends his preaching with this word: "Be perfect just as your heavenly Father is perfect." We are all called to imitate the perfection of the Father in the perfection of love. Jesus shows us the way: he has forgiven his enemies; he does everything to forgive them. He is full of kindness when he receives Judas at the Mount of Olives while some disciples think of revenge. We hear that **revenge is a dish best served cold**. But it is not Christian thinking so; it is contrary to the Gospel. Today Christ asks us to love our enemies. How can we do this? He gives us the answer: "Pray, pray for your enemies." The prayer works miracles.

To love as Jesus loved is to forgive as he forgave those who made him die; it is to stop by to hear the cry of the suffering one as he did for the beggar whom everyone wanted to silence; it is to look without judging as he did for the sinners he met; it is to take the time of prayer to recharge oneself at the source of Love.

We sometimes sing, "What Wondrous Love is This." But from experience, we know that it is difficult to love, especially in the way of the Gospel. The Eucharist that we celebrate each day is a reminder of Christ's love for us. May He help us to remain in this love and to live it every day. Yes, Lord, make us peacemakers, artisans of love.


