Jesus forgives our sins

Second Sunday of Lent | March 5, 2023

Under Mary's mantle, and with the guidance of the Holy Trinity, Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament seeks to share God's love by celebrating the sacraments, proclaiming the gospel, and serving the needs of all His children.

The Feast of the Transfiguration: A moment of clarity

When I was in college, I met a girl. She and I got to talking and we found we had a lot in common. For example, we both had moms who were Directors of Religious Education in the Catholic Church. Every time she saw me, she greeted me with a big smile. I started to think we might develop a deeper relationship.

One day, when we were on our way to class together, someone she knew met up and walked with us. The two of them started into a conversation just between the two of them. I started hearing them talk with such a foul-mouthed string of expletives that it would cause sailors would blush. When we got to class, they sat close together, apart from me. My rival for her attention put an arm around her and pulled her in tight. They remained like that the whole class. My friend seemed very comfortable with this arrangement.

This was a moment of clarity for me—a revelation. In a short space of time, through what she said and who she chose to be near, she revealed who she truly was. Any hopes for a deeper relationship were gone.

What is the Transfiguration? What is its purpose? The transfiguration was a moment of clarity for us—a revelation. In a short space of time, through his words and who he chooses to be near, we learn who Jesus truly is. However, unlike the girl I met, the Transfiguration invites us into a deeper relationship.

What do we learn about Jesus from the Transfiguration?

 God claims him as part of his family, his very Son. Can you think of any better way to indicate someone is important to you than to claim him as family?

- We are to listen to him. There are many people we are urged to listen to, but how many does God Himself urge us to listen to? Aside from certain Old Testament leaders like Moses, very few are endorsed by God. This Jesus has important things to say to us. We should pay attention.
- 3. The Law and the prophets are important to Jesus. Standing with Moses (who represents the Law) and Elijah (who represents the Prophets) Jesus declares by his company what is important to him and what mission he will accomplish.
- 4. Peter, James and John hold a special relationship with Jesus. Again, who you choose to be near you says a lot. Only they are invited to witness this particular event.
- Jesus has a connection to heaven. Surrounded by blinding light, Jesus is more than just an ordinary human, with a connection to great people who have been gone from this world for a long time.

How should we respond to the way that Jesus has revealed himself? Perhaps, like Peter, we want the moment to last. Peter's attempt to build some tents probably seemed like a reasonable idea at the time, but Jesus had other plans. We need to accept what Jesus gives us, let the moment pass, and continue on unafraid.
