Under Mary's mantle, and with the guidance of the Holy Trinity, Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament seeks to share God's love by celebrating the sacraments, proclaiming the gospel, and serving the needs of all His children.

AN EASTER REFLECTION

Eternal throne - Daniel 2:44

There was a Seminary professor who once asked the students in his class this question: How many of you believe that Jesus fulfilled the prophecies of the Messiah in the Old Testament? Every hand went up. He then said good. Now which prophecies did he fulfill? There was silence. You could hear the grass cutting outside the building.

Most of us would answer the same way. We say yes to Jesus fulfilling the prophecies of the Messiah but very few of us would be able to name a particular prophecy found in the Old Testament.

This Sunday's Gospel from Luke is one of the better-known Resurrection stories. It is about the two disciples meeting a stranger on the way to Emmaus. They didn't recognize the stranger as Jesus. They were telling Jesus that the person that they had hoped would be the one to redeem Israel had been crucified, died, and was buried. Some women went to the tomb this morning and did not find his body; they came back and reported that they had indeed seen a vision of angels who announced that he was alive.

Then Jesus said to them: "How slow of heart to believe all that the prophets spoke. Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into his glory? Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them what referred to him in all the Scriptures."

The Scriptures Jesus is referring to are the Old Testament. The New Testament didn't exist yet. Jesus used the Scriptures from the Old Testament to begin opening their eyes by interpreting it for them to understand the meaning of his suffering, death, and resurrection. The disciples did not make that connection until Jesus explained it.

The prophecy that Jesus probably was referring to starting with Moses is Deuteronomy 18:15 and 18:18. There was a prophecy about God raising up a prophet like Moses from among their kindred. This was fulfilled in Jesus.

A few years ago, we had a bible study course on the prophets. They listed 28 other prophecies about the Messiah that were fulfilled in Jesus.

Born in Bethlehem – Micah 5:2 Born of a Virgin – Isaiah 7:14 From King David's line, reign on his throne – Isaiah 9:7 Called Emmanuel - Isaiah 7:14 Called out of Egypt – Hosea 11:1 Way prepared by Messenger – Isaiah 40:3-5, Malachi 3:1 Preceded by Elijah – Malachi 4:5-6 Rejected by his own people – Isaiah 53:1-3 A sacrifice for sin – Isaiah 53:5-12 Bring light to Zebulun and Naphtali, Galilee of the Gentiles – Isaiah 9:1-2 How beautiful the feet of him who brings good news -Isaiah 52:7 Speaks in parables – Isaiah 6:9-10 Heal the brokenhearted – Isaiah 61:1-2 Carry our diseases – Isaiah 53:4 God's Servant - Isaiah 42:1 Called king, enter Jerusalem triumphantly on a donkey – Zechariah 9:9 Betrayed for 30 pieces of silver – Zechariah 11:12-13 Like a lamb to the slaughter – Isaiah 53:7 Tried and condemned - Isaiah 53:8 Silent before accusers – Isaiah 53:7 Spat upon, struck - Isaiah 50:6 Numbered with transgressors – Isaiah 53:12 Hands and feet pierced - Zechariah 12:10 Side pierced – Zechariah 12:10 Buried in a rich man grave - Isaiah 53:9 By his stripes we are healed – Isaiah 53:5 Every knee shall bow – Isaiah 45:23

All these prophecies about the Messiah were fulfilled in Jesus. Jesus' passion, death, and resurrection were all part of God's Plan. Blessed are all who trust in God.

Read a few of these prophecies so when called on you can name one or two.
