What I say to you in the darkness, speak in the light; what you hear whispered, proclaim on the housetops." It has often struck me that our Catholic faith is not based in secrets. If anyone wishes to know what the Catholic Church believes and teaches, they can find it in the Catechism of the Catholic Church—a text that is freely available online and can easily be purchased. If anyone wishes to grow in holiness, it is not hard to learn how. We need not hunt for any secret knowledge, rely on any private revelations, or join some exclusive inner circle.

I try to serve with this kind of transparency as well. It is not difficult for anyone to know my mind, and I am always happy to set time to meet with anyone to answer any questions about our parish. As we approach the three-year anniversary of the canonical unification of Queen of the Rosary and St. Julian Eymard parishes, there is one thing in particular I want to address about the original unification announcement. It was stated that "Cardinal Cupich asks parish leadership to submit a formal evaluation each year with a final determination within three years regarding whether continuing to operate at two campuses best supports the new parish's mission and ministry or if focusing the parish at one campus will more effectively foster unity, steward parish resources, and grow mission outreach."

This announcement was made in the early part of 2020, before we entered into the era of COVID restrictions. Most of our archdiocesan COVID restrictions were lifted in March of 2022. The federal state of emergency ended only in May of 2023. As such, over these first few years of our union as Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament Parish, it has not really been possible to accurately assess our needs for mission and ministry.

In my conversations with archdiocesan staff over these first three years, I have often said that I do not regard the three-year timeline, as outlined in the initial announcement, as realistic and that I did not intend to follow it. The archdiocese understands this, and there are many similar cases in other parishes. Currently, there is not any kind of timeline for a "formal determination" about our two sites. Neither is there any kind of "secret plan" that the archdiocese has for our parish. We will continue to work locally to discern the path God is leading us on.

That said, we should be clear about the challenges we face. Our average weekend Mass attendance has grown slightly but continues to be about half of what it was before COVID. There are added financial, time, and opportunity costs that come with operating two campuses. We know that both sites will require significant investment as we look to grow and expand our ministries. In consultation with parish leadership, I am committed to investing in both of our campuses—as long as it is the course that still makes sense for our mission.

Again, I encourage and invite anyone with any questions or concerns to simply meet with me. It is a good way for us to continue to grow together and share our hearts, so that we may better serve the Lord and His people.




