Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time | July 2, 2023

Under Mary's mantle, and with the guidance of the Holy Trinity, Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament seeks to share God's love by celebrating the sacraments, proclaiming the gospel, and serving the needs of all His children.

#### WELCOME...

The biblical texts of this first Sunday of July (holidays) send us strong words on <a href="https://hospitality.">hospitality</a>. Throughout this summertime, we will have <a href="the opportunity to welcome or be welcomed">the opportunity to welcome or be welcomed</a>. We will meet with different people from elsewhere. Today's first reading is about the prophet Elisha who is welcomed by a foreign woman. This woman is very generous towards him because she recognized him as a man of God. But she carries within her suffering she does not speak of: she has no son, and her husband is old. With great delicacy, Elisha promised her a son that she no longer expected.

Listening to this text of the Word of God, we understand that to accept others is to listen to their confidences, to share their joys and their sorrows. What is important is not the quantity and the luxury but the qualities of the welcome. We Christians have learned that through these people whom we meet, it is God who is there, it is him whom we welcome or refuse to welcome. Let us not forget that it is from our qualities of love and welcome that we will be recognized as disciples of Christ.

In his letter to the Romans, Saint Paul talks to us about the most important day of our life, the day when we were welcomed into the great family of Christians. As we have understood, **this is baptism**. Right now, it could be difficult to understand to its full extent. But we must know that in the early Church, the newly baptized came from a world without God. For them, life had no meaning. But God joined them and welcomed them. Baptism was for them a new birth; it was a radical break with the life they had known until then. On the day of our baptism, we were plunged into that same God's ocean of love in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. From now on we choose to welcome Christ and put him at the center of our life.

This Sunday's Gospel also speaks to us of welcoming. <u>But</u> it makes it very clear that our love for Jesus must come <u>before all family ties</u>: "Whoever loves his father or mother than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me." As we hear these words, we think of catechists who may ask themselves, "Are you kidding me? How does this Gospel help us teach our students to behave well with their families?"

Let us understand: it is perfectly normal for children to love their father and mother more than any other man. There are no stronger bonds than those between parents

and children. We are all very attached to our parents; it is quite natural. And when they are no longer there, it is a hard time for some of us.

But when we look closely, we see that Jesus does not address the great crowd; his words are intended for his apostles. He has called them to follow him. But they must understand that Jesus is not a master among others; he is the Son of God. He is therefore above man. He alone we can and must love more than our beloved ones.

The Lord calls us all to be "disciples and missionaries." The disciple is the one who follows Christ. The missionary is the one who will proclaim him (Christ). Our acceptance of Christ and our attachment to him must come before all family ties. We know that this is not easy; we will have to assert ourselves in the eyes of the world and even in front of the family. We will face indifference and hostility. For many it is persecution. Jesus himself experienced these difficulties; but he went to the end of his mission, to death on a cross.

To welcome Christ, to prefer him to everything, to dwell in him, is what is proposed to us during this summer holiday. We will learn to recognize Christ through the people we meet. The role of the Church, our role as all of us, is exactly to welcome all those who feel attracted by him. It is from these qualities of acceptance that we will be recognized as disciples of Christ.

Every Sunday we gather for the Eucharist; it is God who welcomes us in his house. He invites us to his banquet. And at the end of every Mass, he sends us to bear witness in the world to this gratuitous love always offered. There are opportunities where we can make others happier. Let's not miss them. Through them, it is the Lord who knocks at our door. God is good all the time...






