The man said to the boy, "That's a heavy load you're carrying there." The boy responded, "He ain't heavy; he's my brother."

I have the pleasure of doing baptisms once a month. It's always interesting watching the parents taking care of their baby. It brings back memories of taking care of my kids when they were that age. Changing diapers and getting up in the middle of the night to feed them; getting them dressed and putting them into car seats; making sure that you have everything you might need in the diaper bag when you leave the house. There's a lot to do when taking care of a baby or young children. Doing those things really didn't seem like a burden since they were done out of love. There are a lot of things that we willingly do and sacrifice for our families because we love them. We do it because we want to, not because we have to. It's love that lightens the labor.

The Ten Commandments were given by God to the Israelites out of love as a roadmap for their happiness. It was meant to be liberating not a burden.

However, over time many additional rules were added for example to clarify what was permissible on the Sabbath and what wasn't. There were rules on what was needed to be considered clean in order to worship in the temple. Many of the people in Jesus' time felt overburdened by all the laws and regulations. To reduce that burden, Jesus told them to come to Him and learn from Him.

What is it that we can learn from Christ? To put our trust in Him, to follow Him, and to love as He loves. Christ took the Ten Commandments and the other 600 rules that the Pharisees had and reduced it to two—love God and love your neighbor. It is love that takes the burden out of following God's commandments. You will do it because you want to, not because you have to. Christ's yoke is easy and burden light when shared with Him and done out of love for Him and each other. Another way to look at it is that a yoke is made to put on the necks of two cattle so that together they can pull the plough as one. Jesus is inviting us to share the yoke with him when facing our burdens. He wants to be our yoke partner. He is not saying that our burdens are eliminated. When we face them together, the burden is lighter and easier.

There is another story of a man who had a dream. In the dream he was walking along a sandy beach with Jesus, and they were replaying all the important moments of his life. He noticed that for each scene there were two sets of footprints in the sand, one belonging to him and the other to Jesus. But he also noticed that when they came to the most difficult and trying moments of his life there was only one set of footprints to be seen. The man could not understand this, so he asked Jesus: "Lord, you said that once I decided to follow you, you'd walk with me all the way. Why is it then that during the most difficult period of my life, when I needed you the most, you would leave me?" Jesus replied, "My child, I love you and I would never leave you. During the most difficult moment of your life, when you see only one set of footprints, those were the times I carried you."

Give me O Lord, the courage to love as you love and to put all my trust in you even when I don't understand. Let me remember the words of Jesus, "I will be with you always."






