CURRICULUM & PHILOSOPHY

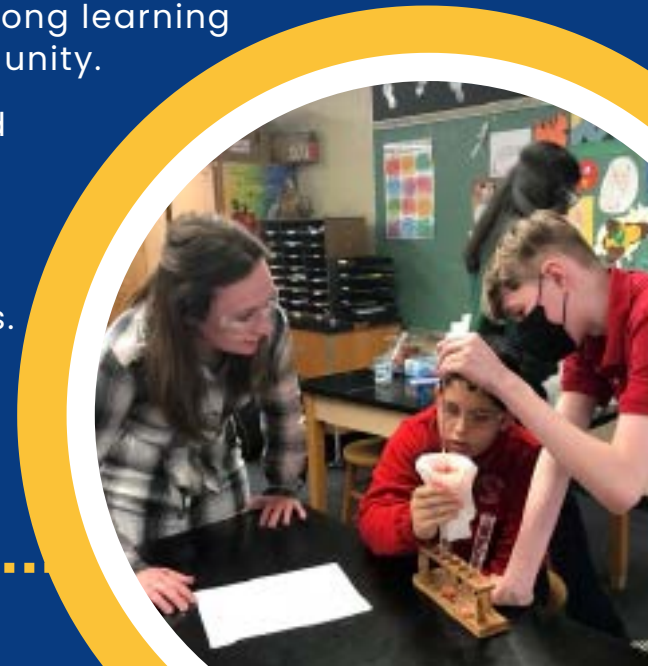
For more than 60 years in Elk Grove Village, Queen of the Rosary School has been providing a faith-based, academically-rigorous education that challenges students to become the best that they can be both academically and spiritually.

Queen of the Rosary School utilizes all resources within the School, the Parish, the Archdiocese of Chicago and the local community to provide a quality Catholic education. In addition to competitive academic programs appropriate for grades pre-K through 8, Queen of the Rosary School offers many extracurricular activities such as:

Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament Parish and the Queen of the Rosary School family are committed to the academic, spiritual and moral development of each child. We believe:

- Schools are not only a community themselves, they are also an integral part of larger communities including Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament Parish, Elk Grove Village and our nation.
- Education of children is the primary responsibility of parents and we recognize that the complete education of children requires the total involvement and commitment of students, teachers and parents.
- The purpose of education is to encourage lifelong learning and active involvement in the Christian community.
- Children learn best by being actively engaged in the learning process.
- Children learn by different means and at different levels of development and so we implement a variety of instructional strategies.
- We recognize and accept cultural differences while embracing our similarities of faith, school and parish community.



TUITION

Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament's Queen of the Rosary School strives to keep tuition rates as accessible as possible. Even so, we understand that a Catholic education may not be affordable for every family looking to provide that opportunity. We offer multi-student discounts* and tuition assistance** may also be available.

Half-Day Pre-School (3 Days) \$3,352 + \$720 fees
Half-Day Pre-School (5 Days) \$4,377 + \$745 fees
Full-Day Pre-School (3 Days) \$4,377 + \$820 fees
Full-Day Pre-School (5 Days) \$6,735 + \$980 fees
Half-Day Kindergarten (5 Days) \$4,377 + \$745 fees

Kindergarten (5 full days) through 8th Grade:

One Child \$6,735 + \$980 fees
Two Children \$11,450 + \$1,220 fees
Three Children \$14,447 + \$1,420 fees
Four or more Children \$15,082 + \$1,620 fees

Extended Care

Before School (7:00 – 8:00 a.m.) \$4 per child, per day
After School (2:40 – 6:00 p.m.) \$14 per child, per day

Fees cover Books & Supplies, Parents Club, Cougar Raffle, Lunch Supervision, Grand Raffle, Spring Fundraiser and Technology. There is an additional fee of \$250 per family with a pre-schooler, and a \$50 fee per family enrolling in Extended Care.

*A family with a full-day pre-school (5 days only) or a full-day Kindergarten student and a student in grades 1-8 qualifies for the two children rate.

**Families requesting tuition assistance are required to submit an application through FACTS. FACTS provides the business office with an assessment of a family's need. All information submitted is secure and confidential. The Pastor, in consultation with the Principal and Tuition Assistance Team, will set the amount of assistance available from the Tuition Assistance Fund in any given year.

REGISTRATION

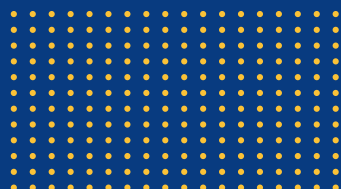

Age Requirements

QR School complies with Illinois State Law for admission into preschool, kindergarten and first grade.



Registration may be taken conditionally in the event that there are outstanding financial obligations to another school or there is a question of a student being in some type of special education program, which QR School is not equipped to provide. This also applies to students with serious discipline problems.

Registration for the upcoming school year opens annually with the start of **Catholic Schools Week**.

What are QR School Hours?

Does QR School have Bus Service?

Service is provided by Dist. 59 for families living 1.5 miles from school.

Does QR School provide Lunch?

Optional hot lunch program provided through FSP.

How does QR School handle Attendance?

Daily attendance is required. For the student's protection, it is expected that an absence be phoned in by 8:30 a.m. daily. Prior to 8:10 a.m., an answering machine will accept the message. The machine will be on whenever no one is in the school office (in the evening, also). Any student absent from school due to illness (or leaves early due to an illness) will not be allowed to attend/participate in extracurricular programs/events.

Do QR School students have to wear Uniforms?

Students in grades K – 8 are required to wear uniforms.

Wearing uniforms:

- Creates a sense of belonging.
- Removes the stress of what to wear for students and parents.
- Helps foster a safe environment by making it easy to identify those who do not belong.
- Provides a way to help manage the expense of school clothes.
