

Dear friends,

This week is our fourth week in our ‘binge’ reading of the Bread of Life discourse in the sixth chapter of the Gospel of John and in our parish we have in the last four weeks been trying to see links between this long conversation of Jesus and the celebration of the Holy Mass. To recap, in the first week, we reflected on the Introduction of the Mass till the Opening Prayer. In the second week, we reflected on the Liturgy of the Word. Last week, which was the third week, we talked about the Creed, the Prayer of the Faithful and the Offertory. This week, we shall be reflecting on how this Bread of Life discourse especially this weekend’s gospel tells us more about the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

In the Gospel this Sunday, Jesus repeats something He told us last week which is that He is the Living Bread come from Heaven. He had an opportunity to rephrase what He said when His hearers did express outrage at what He said but he really doubled down and said “unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His Blood, you will not have Life within you.” A fascinating twist to this passage is to be found in the verb used for eating. The more common Greek verb for eating is φάγη. And that was the verb Jesus used till verse 54. However, once the crowd showed surprise at his message, he decided to opt for another word for eating, a lesser used verb, τρώγων which carries a connotation of chewing with mouth open or to crunch and grind with one’s teeth meaning eating with all seriousness. This tells us about the seriousness Jesus has in mind when He tells us to feed on Him. He wants us to munch on Him for the sustenance of our lives. Unless we feed on Jesus, we cannot have the life that will sustain our lives. Unless we maintain a relationship with Him, our souls will always be poorly fed. This relationship as it exists in the Holy Eucharist is what today’s gospel laid emphasis on. We need to take our reception of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist seriously.

This is the reality we meet in the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Every Eucharistic celebration is an encounter with Jesus. Just to be reminded of that in itself should make us yearn to come for Mass. We are not just meeting the Priest or one another, we are meeting Jesus Himself. At the Eucharist, the Priest acting in the Person of Christ, re-enacts the *Last Supper* in which He gives us the gift of Himself. Our posture even changes at this time of the

Mass. For those who can kneel, we are called to kneel. Even the priest kneels down twice to remind himself that what we have on the altar is Jesus.

A good relationship with Jesus does not just begin when we come to Mass. It involves our preparation for the Mass. It involves going to confession if we have to before we receive the Eucharist. It involves making the Eucharistic fast. Prior to 1964, the Eucharistic fast began at midnight. Pope Paul VI, on November 21, 1964, reduced the fast to a period of one hour. However, Priests who celebrate more than a Mass on a Sunday are not bound by this rule for the second Mass. Also, those who are elderly or sick as well as their caretakers can receive Communion even if a full hour fast has not been fulfilled.

In recent times, there has been a decline in the number of Catholics who believe that Jesus is really present in the Eucharist. Today’s gospel is a reminder that this is not a new thing. Generations after generations have always struggled with one belief or the other. What I would advise is that since Jesus Himself laid this doctrine/belief down, if anyone finds themselves struggling with this belief, rather than stay away from Mass, attend the Mass and ask Jesus to help you as you struggle with the belief. There are multiple examples in history of this prayer being answered.

Today’s Gospel reminds me of the Trilemma formulated by the British author C.S. Lewis when he wrote that “*A man who was merely a man and said the sort of things Jesus said would not be a great moral teacher. He would either be a lunatic—on a level with the man who says he is a poached egg—or else he would be the Devil of Hell. You must make your choice. Either this man was, and is, the Son of God: or else a madman or something worse.... You can shut Him up for a fool, you can spit at Him and kill Him as a demon; or you can fall at His feet and call Him Lord and God. But let us not come up with any patronizing nonsense about His being a great human teacher. He has not left that open to us. He did not intend to.*”

That exactly is what happens at every Mass during the Eucharist. It is so easy to forget that Jesus comes to us at every Mass. Never forget that.






Tuesday Morning Scripture Discussion


