REFLECTION FOR MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS

November in the Catholic Church is the month of the Holy Souls, a month of remembrance where we lovingly honor the departed and pray for the comfort and release of souls in purgatory. The month begins with the Solemnity of All Saints, as we celebrate those who have gone before us in faith and now rest in God's eternal embrace, followed by the Commemoration of All Souls, when we lift up prayers for our faithful departed. Throughout the month, we acknowledge the compassionate efforts of our parish's Bereavement and Grief Share ministries, who walk with those who mourn, offering prayer and support. As part of our "What's My Why" series, we invite you to hear from these dedicated ministers to learn more about their meaningful work and the spiritual blessings they receive in return.

Throughout Scripture, we hear stories of Jesus' personal grief – namely, the loss of His cousin, John The Baptist and of His close friend, Lazarus. And, while there's no specific story, I'm sure Jesus also grieved the death of His earthly father, Joseph. Yes, Jesus, like us, knows loss and grief. But in His grief, Jesus turned toward prayer and opened His heart to others. Jesus' shows compassion.

So it is with those who serve in two of Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament's ministries – Bereavement and Journey of the Heart (JOTH) Grief Share. These ministers are not extraordinary people – just fellow parishioners who understand loss and are able to show compassion. In return, they are blessed.

When asked to reflect on their Ministry and the blessings they receive as ministers, they offered the following reflections:

Jesus Christ modeled how we should treat others and enables us, as His disciples, to show love and compassion to those who suffer in any way. The Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy instruct us to bury the dead, comfort the sorrowful, and pray for both the living and the dead. As a Bereavement Minister, I help families plan the Funeral Liturgy for their loved ones. I support them during this difficult time and I pray for them, their family, and their deceased loved one. My actions and prayers show respect, love, and comfort. I use my gifts, received from God, to be compassionate, hospitable, respectful, and to serve. In return, I become closer to Jesus Christ. I am truly blessed. —*Kathy C.*

Reaching out and touching those in mourning is part of our Bereavement Ministry. We meet with the family to express our sympathy on behalf of our Parish. Listening is the gift we extend and, in hearing, we receive. We pray with them and help them plan readings and music for the Funeral Mass. We pray at the Mass for the deceased. With compassion, we address their concerns and questions. I have received renewed faith, hope, and love for humanity through my Bereavement Ministry work. Sharing our Christian beliefs and putting our loved ones to rest, with God at our side and the guidance of the Holy Spirit, is the essence of the gifts I have received. —*Deb F.*

I find listening to the stories of the deceased beloved enriching. Often, families come to the Funeral Planning Meeting tearful, solemn, or quiet. Then, as they tell their stories and share their memories, it is exciting to see them "come alive" with an inner joy and peace that no sorrow can take away from them. There can even be laughter as they recall their loved one's special and unique traits. This is the beauty of preparing a Celebration of Life - it softens that intense grief. A faith-filled family leaves this planning session with a "celestial glow", recognizing they have made choices that best portray their loved one's character and virtues. This is the key that makes Bereavement a sacramental joy. —*Geri A.*

As both a Bereavement and Journey of the Heart (JOTH) Grief Share minister, I have the unique opportunity to help our parishioners continue their grieving journey after the Funeral Mass. Together, through scripture, we remind ourselves that while faith doesn't prevent storms, it gives us strength to endure and grow. As I listen to their struggles with loss, and share mine with them, I am comforted anew, knowing Jesus is ever present in the middle of all of our personal trials. —Judy L.

We all know grief and loss—maybe more times in our lives than we think we can bear. It is, indeed, a part of life. But the challenge to all of us is to resist the temptation to wallow in our own losses – where there is no hope, no love, no God. Instead, we should choose to demonstrate compassion for others.

Do you have a calling to listen? To be compassionate to those that are suffering loss? To serve God in these very special Ministries? You may think being a Bereavement or JOTH Grief Share Minister too daunting a role. But you would be wrong. Jesus, as your role-model on how to show compassion and love, makes these roles blessed.






