

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

As I write this, we are finishing a very "Marian" week in the Advent season—celebrating the Immaculate Conception on December 9 and Our Lady of Guadalupe on December 12. For both of those beautiful feasts, the reading from the Gospel is the story of the Annunciation in Luke. That passage ends with Mary's great "yes" to God: "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word."

In her willingness to say "yes" to God's will, even though she may not have fully understood it and even though it may not have been the way she thought her life would go, Mary shows us what it means to live out the greatest commandment. "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength." Mary's love for God is so complete that when God's will is made known to her by the message of the angel Gabriel, she changes her own will and her own desires to be united with God's.

We were blessed to have Fr. Louis Mboe return to celebrate the Mass for Our Lady of Guadalupe, and in his homily he focused on this same point. Are we going to take up the example of our Blessed Mother? Are we willing to unite our will to God's? When God shows us a new way forward, do we reorient our steps to follow it? It is a question we have to ask ourselves at every opportunity, and especially as we prepare our hearts for the celebrations of Christmas.

This week's Gospel picks up from that moment of the Annunciation. Mary sets out and travels "in haste" from Nazareth to the "hill country" of Judah. It is a journey of about 70 miles, or about the distance from here to Milwaukee. She does this to rejoice with her cousin, who has received news of great joy, and to be of service to her cousin in the final months of her pregnancy.

We recall that Jesus said there were two parts to the greatest commandment. The second is "to love your neighbor as yourself." See, then, how Mary fulfills the whole of the commandment: she is a living example of how to love God and neighbor. She keeps the word of the Lord and ponders it in her heart, and she also is ready to spring into action so that the love of God may be made present and real through her. Truly, how beautiful it is for us to have such a mother, who is always ready to let God become incarnate through her, even as He becomes incarnate within her!

The presence of Mary, and the presence of God taking flesh through her and within her, gives great joy to her cousin. As we allow God to take flesh through us, in our actions of love and charity, and within us, through the Eucharist, may we also bring great joy to everyone we encounter!


