WHAT'S MY WHY?

Each of us has a unique journey of faith, much like the Magi who followed the star to find Jesus in this Sunday's Gospel from Matthew for Epiphany. Their quest was guided by hope, purpose and a longing for something greater. In that same spirit, we invite you to discover what inspires and sustains faith in the hearts of our parishioners. Here's a former parishioner's "What's My Why" story—a reflection on how God's light has guided her path.

I was born into our Catholic faith. I attended a Catholic grammar school, St. Tarcissus Parish on the northwest side of Chicago. It was very comfortable for me to be there as my older brother and sister had also attended St. Tars and eventually went on to Catholic High Schools, Gordon Tech and Cardinal Stritch. But when I was 10 years old, in 5th grade, my Dad passed away at only 46 and this set a little different path for me. I finished out St. Tars, but went on to a public high school—Taft High School in Chicago. I don't think it bothered me then that I wasn't continuing with Catholic education, thinking I had the foundational 8 years of it at St. Tars and was obviously baptized, made my First Holy Communion, Reconciliation, and Confirmation there. But I didn't realize how much more there was to learn and grow with further instruction and influence.

In Senior year at Taft, I met my husband to be, and we dated 8 years before we finally married after he finished law school. During this time, I grew close to his family, particularly his mother, an angel of a woman, who treated me as her own. During these years, and for a couple years after I married into the family, she had two battles with cancer, and her resolute faith kept her, and all of us, through the worst of days. She was so courageous and showed us such strength as she faced her fate, depending solely on her steadfast belief in her faith. With daily Mass, rosary and prayers, she grew very close to the Heavenly Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and the Virgin Mary. It became her lifestyle and influenced us all. Her honor to Mother Mary set the tone for our entire family, and to this day, we rely heavily on the Virgin Mary when we are feeling weak and in need of support.

As I had children, I grew more in my faith, realizing the miracle of birth and how blessed I was to have 3 children, and I wanted the best for them. This meant a Catholic upbringing and brought me to Queen of the Rosary over 37 years ago. My 3 children went to preschool through 8th grade, making all their sacraments at QR, and I was involved with many volunteer opportunities at the school. My children continued on to Driscoll Catholic High School, and then DePaul University, carrying on the Catholic tradition. Both of my daughters were married at Queen of the Rosary Parish, as there would be no

other way to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage but to seal their unions in the Catholic church. My children's exposure to our faith through our Parish and school, made a deep and lasting impression on them. All 3 of my grandchildren were also baptized at QR and attended QR School (we just recently moved out of state), and I was back there also—volunteering as a Lunch Supervisor two days per week.

As I was busy raising the children during those early years at QR, I had an epiphany in my life. One day I was approached going into Sunday Mass at QR and asked if I would consider becoming a Eucharistic Minister. I wouldn't have thought about it before that moment as I'm not one to get up in front of people and have attention on me like that, and I thought I was busy forming my children's spirituality. But what about me doing some more growing? When I was asked that question that fateful day, I felt the Holy Spirit was encouraging me to do it. It was time for me to grow in my faith some more. So, I decided to do it. I so enjoyed being a minister, it made me feel even closer to the Lord by serving Him and my fellow parishioners. It was the best thing I could have done for my own faith life, to grow in relationship to Our Lord. Before we moved, I also volunteered with the Good Samaritan Ministry, cooking for Suppers throughout the year. Taking care of, and giving to people less fortunate than I, is so important, something we are called to do, and something I take joy in.

I hope reading about my 'why' encourages you to challenge yourself to always grow in faith and find ways to "Be Transformed" in your relationship with Christ. Rejoice in the faithfulness of God and the enduring mercy He shows us. He wants us to transform to be the best Christians we can be! Take His challenge and you will only be the better for it. And when the day comes for each of us to meet our glorious Lord, let us impress Him by showing how we took all His blessings on this earth and nurtured the growth and development of our faith, for ourselves and others!




