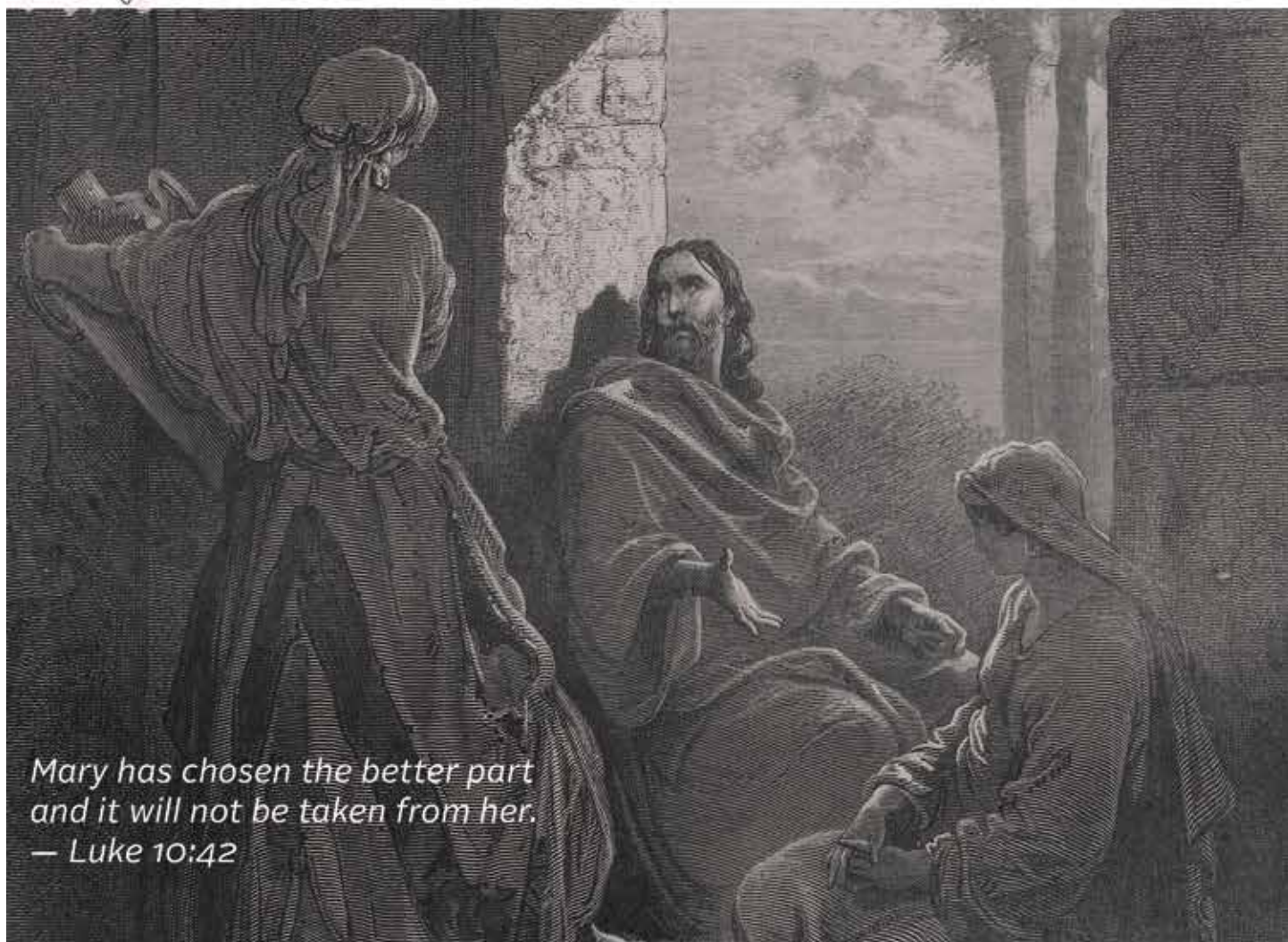

MULTI SITE REVIEW

As our team comes together for the Multi Site Review, we wanted to share this reminder from the February, 2020 decision announcement...

When Cardinal Cupich first announced the decision to unite Queen of the Rosary and St. Julian Eymard (a decision informed by a unanimous 32-0 vote by his Presbyteral Council), he requested that we submit annual evaluations, with a final decision expected within three years on whether continuing to operate as two campuses was in the parish's best interest. While this wasn't addressed in the formal decree, Cardinal Cupich's request remains.

Though the timeline originally pointed to a decision within three years, the reality is that we did not begin the formal review process until now—largely due to outside factors like the pandemic, which limited our ability to gather and reflect as a community. However, now that we are five years into our journey as one parish, we believe we have a fairly solid picture of what our community looks like today—how we worship, how we serve and how we grow together in faith.

This process is not about buildings—it's about mission. It's about discerning, together, whether continuing with two campuses is best, or if focusing the life of the parish at one campus might better foster unity, help us steward resources more wisely and grow our outreach and evangelization efforts.

We also want to be clear that the Multi Site Review is not a new endeavor, nor is it being introduced by our current pastor, Fr. Art. About a year ago, Fr. Dan announced the decision to undertake this review now, in anticipation of participating in an Archdiocesan Capital Campaign next year. It's important that we evaluate our multi-site structure before moving forward with any significant new investments, so we can be confident we're stewarding parish resources wisely and planning responsibly for the future.

As the Multi-Site Review team comes together and begins this process, we are committed to keeping you informed and walking forward together in faith, hope and charity. Please continue to keep the Multi Site Review team, our parish and this process in your prayers.

Excerpt from the Cardinal's Decree Cover Page

Second, the decree states that both of the churches of Queen of the Rosary and St. Julian Eymard will be churches of the new parish. As you recall, the February decision announced both of our churches will continue to have regularly scheduled Mass. Additionally, we learned Cardinal Cupich asked the new parish's leadership to submit a formal evaluation each year with a final determination within three years regarding whether to continue to operate at two campuses will best support our new parish's mission and ministry or if focusing the parish at one campus will more effectively foster unity, steward parish resources, and grow mission outreach. That request of Cardinal Cupich still remains, though it is not an element addressed in the decree.
