

Our workweek included creating a woodchip path to a shrine dedicated to Our Lady of Guadalupe; staining and sealing a fence; weeding forest areas and seminary outdoor class areas; power-washing an art building; hanging art for a public art show

with a portion of the show proceeds directly supporting the seminary. One of the lead Friars of the seminary was with us over half of the hours of our work-week; engaging in spiritual stories and the works of St. Francis of Assisi. The Friar's words of thanks and the testimonies provided by recipients of CHWC volunteer hours provide perspective to how blessed most of us are in life. It is truly powerful seeing and hearing what 300+people can accomplish in 4 days!

We couldn't be prouder of our amazing teen community. The way you show up, serve, and shine is truly inspiring! And there are so many more ways to jump in. 




