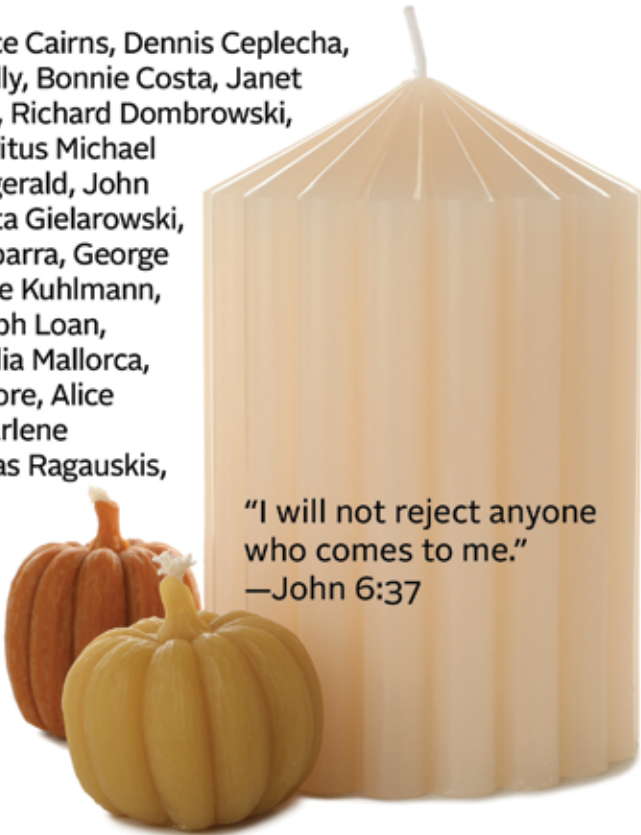

This All Souls Day, our Bereavement and Grief Share Ministries invite us to pause and reflect on the hope and comfort found in God's love. This year, one of our ministers—who also shares her gifts through our Music Ministry—has beautifully woven her love of music into her reflection. Let her words inspire our hearts and lift our spirits. Please read on...

For this is the will of my Father, that everyone who sees the Son and believes in him may have eternal life, and I shall raise him on the last day. (John 6:40)

We gather today to remember those loved ones who have gone to their Eternal home with the Lord God, this past year. We also remember those Loved Ones who we hold in our heart and pray in communion with them. We know that God has promised that he will raise us all on the last day. Many will go to their Eternal reward sooner than others, but we will all join together on that glorious day. Today's All Souls Feast is to celebrate our loved ones. We acknowledge our loss, and remember how we love and miss them. But they are truly with us always. As we take time to pray for their beloved Souls, we take comfort in knowing that they will rest in peace.

When we sing, we are twice praying. There are so many wonderful hymns that are appropriate, but I want to reflect on two songs that spoke to me. The first is "I Am the Bread of Life", by Suzanne Toolan in which she sets these words to music in verse 3:

"I am the Resurrection, I am the Life, If You believe in me, even though You die, You shall Live forever."

We are reminded in this song that we are all able to earn Eternal Life with the Trinity. We all acknowledge God the Father & Son, but in the past years, especially since I've been involved in Journey of the Heart, I've seen the powerful work of the Holy Spirit in action. He is who guides us and gives us the power to get through these difficult times of loss.

The second song, "Eternal Life", by Olive Dungan and is close to my heart.

"Lord, make me an instrument of Thy peace;
Where there is hatred, let me sow love;
Where there is injury, pardon;

Where there is doubt, faith;
Where there is despair, hope;
Where there is darkness, light;
Where there is sadness, joy.
O Divine Master, grant..... that I may not....
so much seek
To be consoled as to console,
To be understood as to understand,
To be loved as to love;
For it is in giving that we receive
It is in pard'ning that we are pardoned,
It is in dying.... that we are born
To Eternal Life"

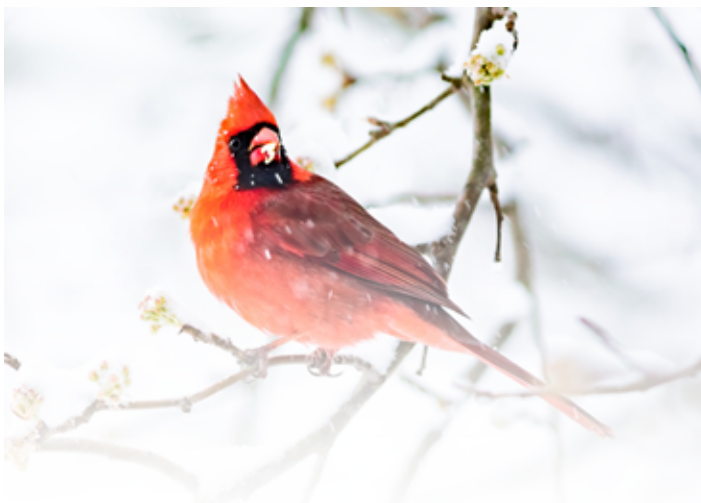

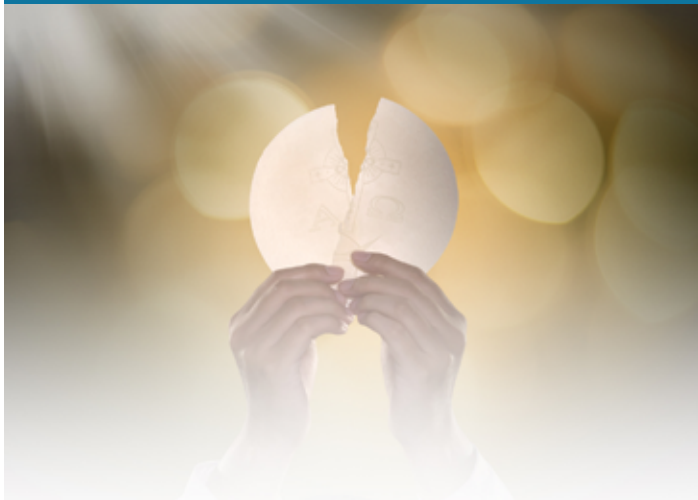
