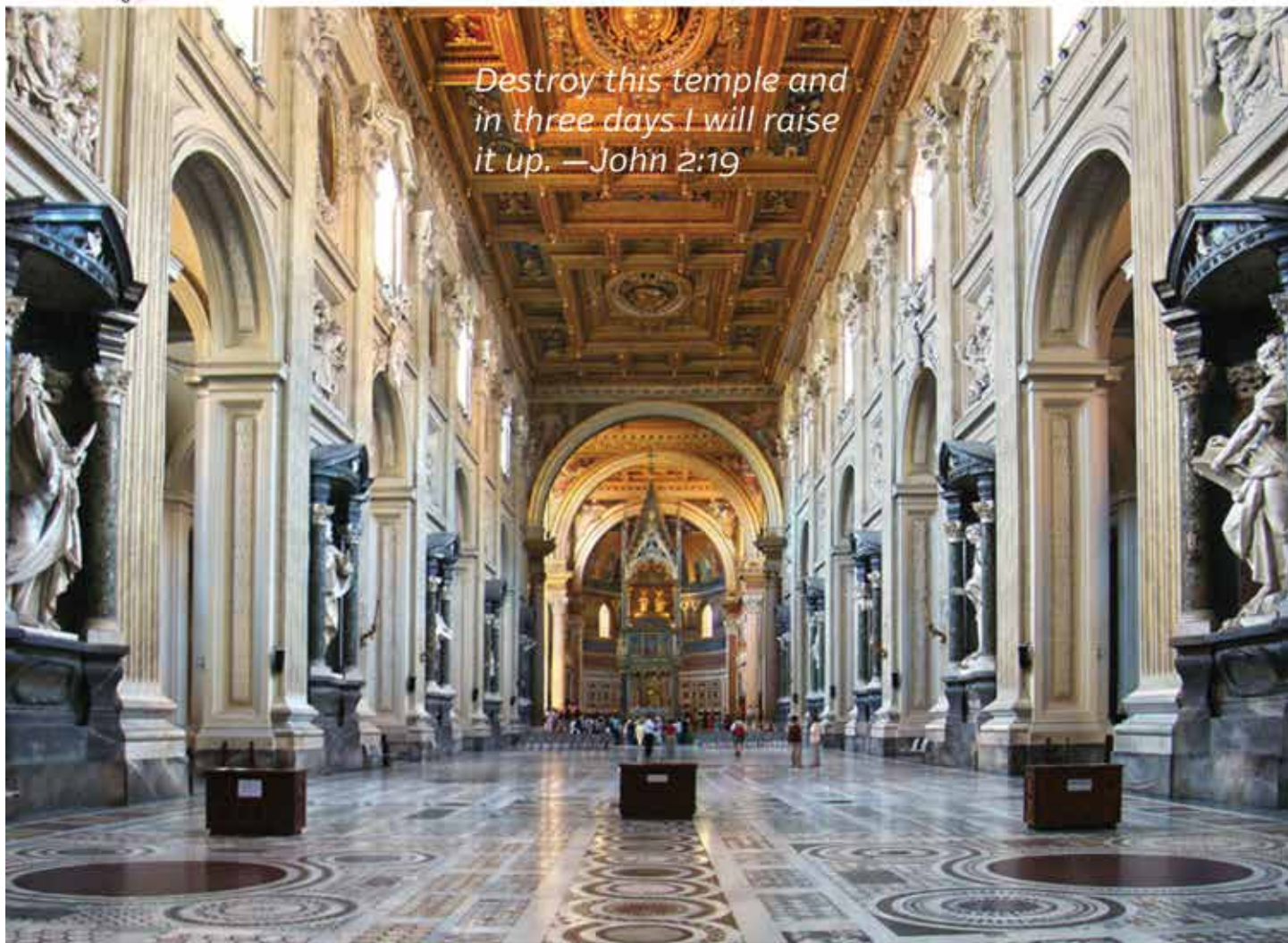

UPDATE FROM OUR MULTI-SITE REVIEW TEAM

Dear Parish Family,

As we continue our journey through the Multi-Site Review (MSR), we want to keep you informed about how this process is unfolding and what it means for the future of our OLBS community. The goal of the MSR is simple: to take a thoughtful look at our parish facilities and prayerfully discern how each one can best support the worship, ministry, and mission of our parish moving forward.

Recently, our team—made up of parishioners representing our worship and ministries including our Queen of the Rosary School— revisited a facility assessment originally conducted by the Archdiocese in 2019. That report outlined the condition of our buildings and identified needed maintenance and repair projects. Many of those projects have since been completed, and our maintenance manager, Matt Ellefson, recently updated the list to reflect what remains. Last week, the MSR team joined Matt for a walk-through of our campus to see firsthand where our opportunities and challenges lie.

Next month, we'll take a closer look at the parish's financial picture, including trends in attendance, ministry participation, and facility usage. By combining this information with what we've learned from our walkthroughs, we hope to develop a clearer sense of the space we truly need and how we can best care for it in a sustainable way.

This effort is not just about buildings and bottom lines, it's about building community. It's about making sure our spaces continue to serve as places of prayer, welcome, and encounter with Christ for generations to come.

We'll share another update early in December, and we look forward to a parish-wide town hall in early 2026 where we'll present our findings and invite your input as we discern together the next steps for the Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament Parish/Queen of the Rosary School MSR project.
