Our Mission

Under Mary's mantle, and with the guidance of the Holy Trinity, Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament seeks to share God's love by celebrating the Sacraments, proclaiming the Gospel, and serving the needs of all His children.



NOW AND AT THE HOUR OF OUR DEATH

Every human life is a sacred gift from God, deserving of love and protection from conception to natural death.

Those words take on particular significance this month. On September 12, physician-assisted suicide became legally available in Illinois under the End-of-Life Options for Terminally Ill Patients Act.

The new law allows certain adults diagnosed with an incurable and irreversible illness and given a prognosis of six months or less to live to request medication intended to end their lives. There are requirements and safeguards built into the law: a patient must be at least 18, an Illinois resident, have the capacity to make medical decisions, and have the diagnosis and prognosis confirmed by two physicians. The request must come personally from the patient and cannot be made by a family member, guardian, health care proxy or advance directive.

But as Catholics, the more important question for us is not simply what the law allows. It is how we are called to respond when someone we love is suffering.

Our Catholic response is different. When someone is facing serious illness, suffering or the end of life, we draw closer. We accompany. We care. We remain.

That means excellent medical care and effective pain management. It means hospice and palliative care. It means spiritual support and the Sacraments. It means the loving presence of family, friends and the Church. And it means helping those who are suffering know, especially in their most vulnerable moments, that their lives remain precious and that they are never a burden to us.

Compassion means suffering with another. Care means remaining with them.

As we approach Respect Life Month in October, we will share reflections on the sacredness and dignity of human life throughout the whole journey—from conception to natural death, and especially in those moments when human life is most vulnerable.

Our belief in the dignity of human life is not merely something we proclaim. It asks something of us. It asks us to care for one another when life becomes difficult, uncertain or painful. It asks us to accompany rather than abandon, to relieve suffering without intentionally ending the life of the person who suffers, and to remain beside one another even when we cannot make everything better.

Because every person is deserving of dignity, love and care through every stage of life.

Our commitment is simple and unwavering: **To love. To protect. To accompany. To care.**

Now and at the hour of our death.
